SANTA CRUZ, CA — MARCH 29, 2022 — The Santa Cruz Museum of Natural History's annual spring exhibit, <u>*The Art of Nature*</u>, opens to the public April 2, on view through June 5. The exhibit features works from over 30 local artists in a variety of mediums, all sure to inspire curiosity and deepen connections with science and nature. Hands-on activities within the exhibit inspire budding artists of all ages to engage their observational skills while illustrating museum specimens.

"The Museum has been exhibiting science illustration since 1989 and this beloved annual show is guaranteed to appeal to lovers of both science and art," says Visitor Services Manager Liz Broughton, who has organized the show for over ten years.

An online version of the exhibit will also launch on April 2, with expanded interpretation, deeper dives into the artists' work, and links to Museum educational content about scientific illustration for adults and children. Fans of science illustration can also find a wide array of prints, cards, and stickers from exhibit artists in the Museum Store, both online and in-person.

"What I love most about scientific illustration is its power to convey scientific concepts in artwork that is both beautiful and accessible," says Executive Director Felicia B. Van Stolk. With this exhibit, and the accompanying programs, the Santa Cruz Museum of Natural History continues to advance its mission of connecting people with science and nature in meaningful ways.
