

Making your own Wet Palette



What is a wet palette?

A container that has a wet bottom layer to keep the paints on the top parchment from drying out. The main goal of the wet palette is to keep your paints wet for the entire painting session. If your container has a sealable lid, you can extend that paint for future painting sessions (3-5 days). This reduces paint waste and allows you to paint at a relaxed pace. you don't have to do everything in one sitting! The paints staying wet allows you to apply thin, even coats of paint onto our miniatures. It also helps with blending and mixing in colors to achieve a specific shade. The best part about a wet palette is that you can make one from common household items.

What do you need?

- 1. Any small container
 - a. Tupperware
 - b. Small square tin (like breath mint tins)
- 2. Parchment paper (it **must** be parchment paper)
- 3. A wet layer underneath it
 - a. A Sponge, or Sponge Cloth, or soaked paper towel
- 4. Water
